The students were trained to work on the search strategy in the Cochrane, PubMed and Scopus. They screened the relevant studies using the Rayyan tool. They were asked to read the complete manuscript of the selected studies. Then to collect the specified data in a data extraction form. Further they were trained to work on the RevMan 5.0 to assess the risk of bias of the individual selected studies and then to plot the forest plot and interpret the results. GradePro was used to asses the level of evidence and the strength of recommendations of the evidence of the selected studies. During the entire process the staff members were involved to guide the students and Dr. Krishna Undela from JSSCPM was consulted when the students were had to clarify certain doubts and re-confirm the interpretation of the results. The selected titles and the review details were uploaded to onto PROSPERO for the registration of the review.
