A two days National Symposium on "Nutrikinetic Assessment of Functional Foods from Indian Origin - Their Scientific and Global Perspective" was organised by the department of Pharmaceutical Analysis, JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty on 30<sup>st</sup> November and 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017.
